Video Transcript: Solution Statement

Now, we're focusing on crafting a solution statement

The aim is to transition from pinpointing problems to how you'll creating innovations, and the goal is to make this as clear and accessible as possible.

The main areas and questions to answer are

1. how does the solution work – without being overly technical give a broad outline of the tech and solution workflow including how does it solve the problem”?
2. What is your short term vision or roadmap for taking the solution to the next stage

Confirm what the current status of your solution is?

Early concept – Prototype – Live with initial traction – Make this status clear

Consider the development process, the technologies required, and any notable project timeline information. Lay out achievable goals for the next 12 months – is it to create a POC – is it to bring a concept to market – or extend a client base

3. After mapping out your immediate future, it's time to gaze further into your 'Long-Term Vision.' Think about where you want your tech solution to be in several years. How will it adapt and evolve? How will it continue to serve its users as technology and societal needs change?

‘The how’ is important but the clarity and compelling nature and communication of the overall solution in the short and longer terms is more important than the technical details of your proposed solution.
